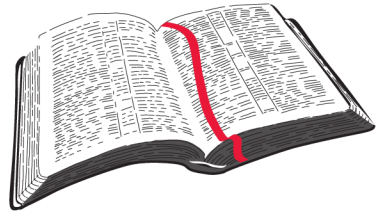


EXPLORING VIRTUES

HOW TO USE



A note to the parent/guardian -

Teaching your children about the virtues we read about in the Bible is an engaging way to help fill yours and your children's hearts with God's Word!

This printable packet allows families the opportunity to -

- **Dive into the Bible and find out what God teaches about each virtue together!**
- **Discuss the different ways a person may live their life portraying character traits that reflect each virtue.**
- **Use the printouts for each virtue as a way to help reiterate what has been learned.**



Each printable pack includes the following-

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- **A "teaching tool" page to help kick-start the virtue/character trait exploration.**
- **A "design-your-own-character" page that gives children the opportunity to color, draw, and design their character however they like. This sheet also includes space for children to write-out the qualities found in a person with each virtue. There's even space at the top of the page to name their character! There are also 3 separate "design-your-own-character" sheets to choose from!**
- **A "Bible verse" page to write-out the virtue Scripture found while exploring.**

TEACHING TOOL for HUMBLE



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The following page includes a Bible verse about the virtue along with a few thoughts on what HUMBLE means according to God's Word.

The Bible is full of verses that talk about this virtue so don't stop with just one! Dig and find a few more that you can explore together!

And, while you explore this virtue with your children follow through with what Deuteronomy 6:7 tells us to do as parents. Take some time to memorize God's Word together!

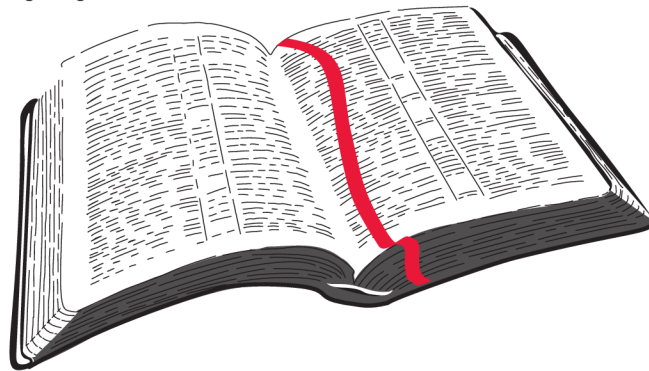

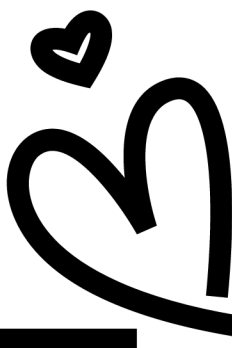


"Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves. Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too."

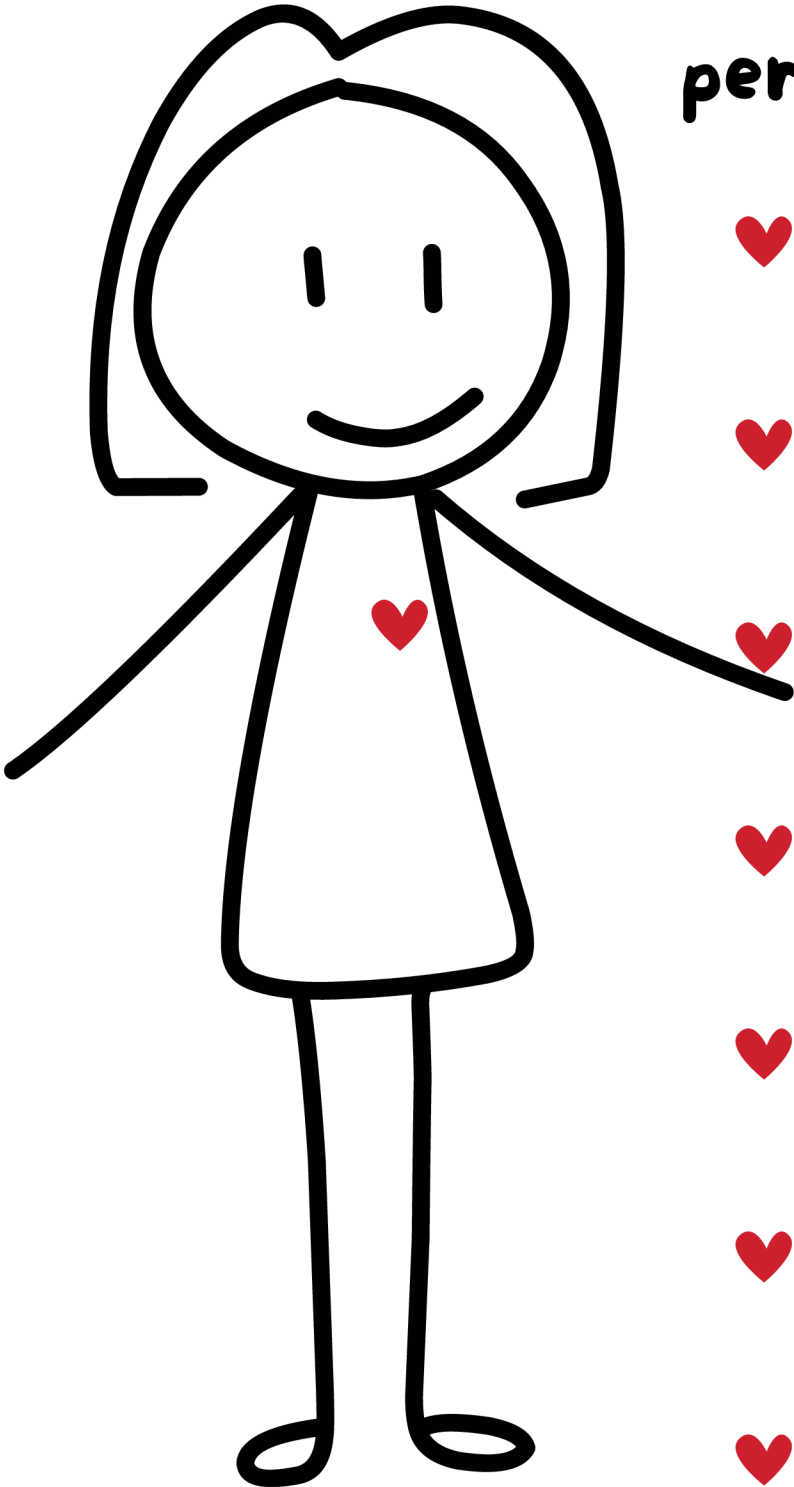
The following 3 pages are designed to give your children a few different choices as they get creative pondering all they've learned about the virtue - HUMBLE!

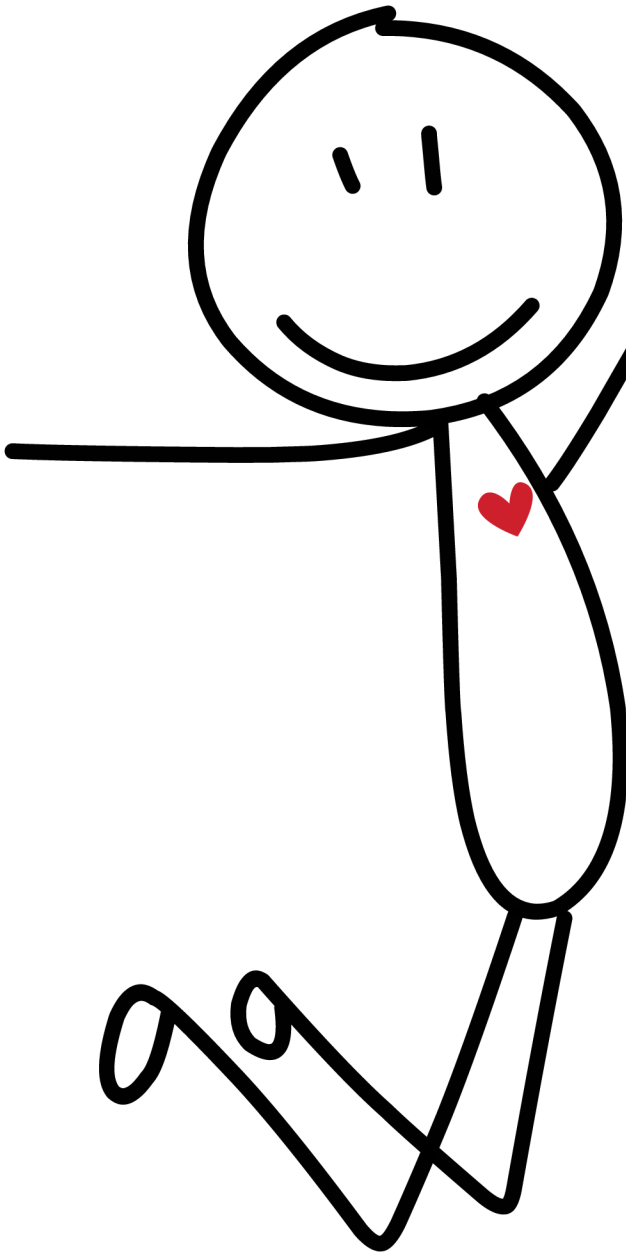



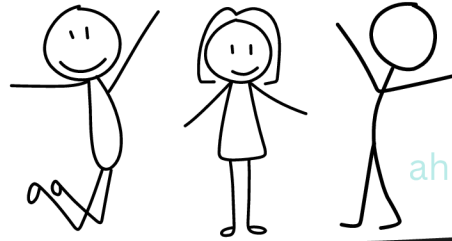
